#### Cllr Bird and James

Please see attached a formal request from the Programme Management Office for me as Chair of Working Group to use the Delegated Authority awarded by the Joint Committee. The PMO have requested that this be exercised to approve two bids - firstly for £40,000 for the ICT Academy - PTP Training (Walsall) project, a request for a £40k top-up to enhance a previous engineering-based project award. Secondly, for the first phase of the Very Light Rail (VLR) project Development Study - £150k in 2015/16. This will be underwritten by Dudley MBC.

LEP Board approval was achieved for both on 25/01/2016. As the next Joint Committee meeting is not until 09/03/2016, approval under Delegated Authority is sought to enable the projects to complete and claim in full by 31/03/2016. This would be unachievable using the usual approval route.

As you will be aware, the process for approval under Delegated Authority requires that as Chair, I consult with the following prior to approving the request: the Chief Executive of the Consortium, the Section 151 Officer at Walsall Council and the Working Group member under whose geographical area the project sits. I confirm that both as Chair of the Working Group and the relevant sponsoring WG member for the PTP bid I support this request in principle pending consultation with yourselves. You will note from the attached request that Sarah Middleton has endorsed this request. Alan has agreed to the VLR proposal and again Sarah has signed this off too.

Please find attached and below executive summaries of the projects for your information.

Once you have reviewed the requests, please advise whether you endorse, endorse with comments or do not endorse the requests. The JC Programme Management team will then approach you for signature.

#### 1. ICT Academy, PTP Training Walsall, £40k in 2015/16

This bid is seeking to build upon the success of the FAB KIT Project within the PTP Engineering Training Centre in Walsall. It would develop a further learning offer to deliver engineering ICT based qualifications and courses. The basis of this bid is focused consultation with local employers to establish their ICT Training requirements, which has revealed that local businesses need additional skills to those currently offered by PTP in the Engineering and manufacturing sector:

The PTP offer in terms of Apprenticeships and short courses will be extended to include:

- ICT based Estimating and quotation systems, to increase the speed of response from Businesses.
- Stock control/MRP systems
- Additional CNC modules for the sheet metal and fabrication industry to improve speed of programming, efficiency
  of material usage, improved cutting times. Press-brake forming modules to check viability of tooling and press set
  ups.

This bid would fund the additional software and hardware required to train on these systems & applications.

The project will target outputs of **145 Business assists**, **146 Learner Assists** and **80 Apprenticeship** starts (predominantly at Level 3) by 2020/21.

#### 2. Very Light Rail (VLR) Development Study, £150k in 2015/16

This is a development study for a £28.7m project which, through the creation of an Innovation Centre and Test Track in Dudley, will support the development of the very light rail sector and potential growth of a new UK industry supplying domestic and international rail schemes. Its facilities will also provide companies with a significant opportunity to develop new very light rail solutions. The Very Light Rail Innovation Centre and Test Track project which has been recognised could support a wider programme of transport improvements in the Black Country including helping to tackle some of the congestion problems facing both businesses and visitors to the area; providing access to key employment sites; and developing a supply chain to this new sector.

The construction of a National Innovation Centre and Test Track facility on the Castle Hill site in Dudley will deliver a range of outputs, including new jobs (potentially up to 300), up to 330 apprenticeships, around 80 business assists plus additional learner assists.

Note, approval for the remaining £150k of the VLR funding (phase 2 - 2016/17) will be taken via the usual Joint Committee process.
