Has the AAP been prepared in accordance with the Duty to Cooperate and is it based on effective joint working with adjacent local planning authorities and other prescribed bodies on any relevant cross boundary strategic priorities including:

- **Natural England**, with regard to Sustainability Appraisal and Habitat Regulations Assessment and the impact of proposed development on protected sites within the Borough; and
