Mallets and hammers	Blows, particularly to the hands	Particularly children, although other people might be affected	<ul> <li>upright position onto a child's head</li> <li>Only KS3+ children should work with rivets</li> <li>Place a hand over the child's hand when they are stamping a keyfob or holes in a dog collar, etc. We should always fix the rivet when making a dog collar or a hedgehog</li> <li>Make sure that children are not silly and/or lose concentration when using a mallet or a hammer</li> <li>We should make the finger holes when we are making dinosaur finger puppets</li> <li>When using the leaf/floral motif stamps see if the children can stamp the leather by hand pressure only. If mallets are required provide only plastic/light wooden mallets to the children</li> </ul>	1	2	2	Yes
Needles	Allergic reaction to a needle prick	Anyone who is prone to going into shock at a needle prick	Use only blunt needles which should not pierce the skin.	1	3	3	Yes
Glue	Poisoning/allergic reaction	Children and staff	Gluing a purse may present a safer alternative to stitching if people are known to be susceptible to needle prick shock. Use only child friendly glue.	1	2	2	Yes
