

The Local Authority has agreed to assess for an Education, Health and Care Needs Assessment (EHCNA)

What happens next?

**Step 1** - After the decision to assess has been made, the local authority must seek information and advice on your child/young person's needs from a range of professionals e.g. education, health and social care.

## How long does this take?



The advice from professionals should be received by the local authority **6 weeks** from the advice request date.

## Step 2 – Child views and parent/carer views

It is very important that we get your child/the young person's views and also your views as parent/carer.

If these have not already been provided with the request for assessment, we will write to you and ask you to complete a **Child Views** and **Family** 

**Conversation**. The school SENCO and Walsall SENDIAS can help with this.



**Step 3 -** When we have received the completed advice from professionals, we will make a decision about the outcome of the EHCNA.

You will be notified of the outcome by letter.



If the local authority decides **not to issue** an EHC Plan, you must be notified by no later than **16 weeks** from the date of the first request to assess.
