BLACK COUNTRY AIR QUALITY

SUPPLEMENTARY PLANNING DOCUMENT (SPD) 2016

Walsall Council adopted the Black Country Air Quality Supplementary Planning Document (SPD) by a decision of its Cabinet on 8th February 2017.

This adoption statement is required by Regulation 14 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Development) (England) Regulations 2012.

Title of Document: Black Country Air Quality Supplementary Planning Document (SPD) 2016

Subject Matter: The Black Country Air Quality SPD 2016 provides detailed guidance on Walsall Council's requirements in relation to air quality, for all those involved in the submission and determination of those planning applications where air quality needs to be addressed.

Area of Document: The SPD applies to the entire Walsall Council local authority area. As it is also adopted by the other 3 Black Country Authorities the SPD will apply across the entire Black Country area.
