### Adoption Statement

#### Title

Walsall Site Allocation Document (SAD) January 2019.

#### Subject Matter

The Site Allocation Document (SAD) allocates sites for development for housing, employment and other uses across the borough (except for town and district centres) up to 2026.

The SAD was adopted on 7 January 2019 and replaces some of the 'saved' policies and proposal of the Walsall Unitary Development Plan (2005).

The SAD has been subject to examination by an independent inspector appointed by the Secretary of State and the adopted SAD incorporates a number of modifications as set out in the Inspector's Report.

#### Challenge

Any person aggrieved by the adoption of the SAD may make an application to the High Court under section 133 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 (as amended) on the grounds that the document is not within the appropriate power or that a procedural requirement has not been complied with. Any such application must be no later than six weeks after the date on which the SAD was adopted.
