

Kevin Baker: Journey to Becoming an FLT Instructor with Forward Step

Kevin joined the Walsall Works programme in October 2024 after being made redundant from JCB, following 37 years at Wienerberger UK. With a strong background in forklift operations and quality control—but only an in-house licence—our first step was to support him in gaining a formal FLT qualification to improve his employability.

We helped update his CV to reflect his extensive experience and coached him through application and interview techniques. Kevin completed his FLT training with Forward Step in Walsall, successfully passing in December 2024. His performance stood out, and he was approached about the opportunity to train as an instructor.

With funding support from Walsall Works, Kevin enrolled on the instructor training course at RS Training in Birmingham in January 2025. Upon completion, he began working as an FLT Instructor at Forward Step on 17 February 2025.

Kevin's decades of hands-on experience bring exceptional value to his training sessions, and he sets a high standard for those entering the industry.

Perseverance Pays Off: SB Secures Full-Time Employment with Support from Walsall Works

When SB joined the Restart programme with Walsall Council, she was actively job hunting but struggling to secure a role despite attending multiple interviews. With dedicated one-to-one support from her Advisor, Eunice, they refined her applications, prepared for interviews, and identified suitable opportunities together.

After months of persistence, SB applied for an Advisor role that matched her skills. Although uncertain about the outcome, she remained hopeful—and later that day, she received the job offer. She is now working full-time, supporting others on their employment journeys.

EXPO & Apprenticeship Show







On Thursday 13 March 2025, the Walsall Works Expo celebrated its 10th year with another successful job fair.

Held at Walsall College's The Hub, the event saw over 1000 local job seekers engage with 76 employers and training providers. The Walsall Works Expo is one of the largest job fairs in the West Midlands.

Councillor Pardeep Kaur, Portfolio Holder for Education and Skills at Walsall Council, said: "I was honoured to open the Expo on its 10th anniversary and to see such a fantastic turnout. The Expo events are exactly what's needed to connect local people with opportunities in both work and education and every year the events just get bigger and better."

"This Expo saw over 1000 people engaging with over 70 local employers and training providers and I'm sure that people who attended will have really benefitted from the event. A big well done to everyone involved."

Walsall Works has been delivering vital employment support to the people of Walsall for over 13 years, having been set up in 2012 to support local people to get back into work.

One of the exhibitors that attended the event to share opportunities on behalf of their business, said: "We had a great time connecting with so many people, meeting potential candidates, and engaging with businesses within our community. It was a brilliant opportunity, and we truly appreciate all the effort that went into organising it."

This year also saw the first Walsall Works Apprenticeship Show which began after the Expo closed.

Twenty businesses and providers offering apprenticeship opportunities in construction, engineering, logistics, care, IT & technology and much more, stayed on after the Expo to provide information and advice to more than 200 people, made up of Walsall students from nearby schools and Walsall college, young people from outside the borough and parents.
